## Media Ecosystems & Information Asymmetry

### Network Propaganda

A detailed empirical study of how asymmetric media ecosystems developed in the United States, particularly within right-wing media networks, and how they contribute to polarization and misinformation.

### The Death of Truth

An accessible examination of how postmodern relativism, political cynicism, and digital media have eroded shared standards of truth.

### Post-Truth

Explores the philosophical and political roots of post-truth culture and the deliberate undermining of factual reality.

## Democratic Backsliding & Institutional Fragility

### How Democracies Die

Identifies warning signs of democratic erosion and explains how elected leaders can weaken democratic norms from within.

### On Tyranny

A concise reflection on historical lessons from authoritarian regimes and the civic responsibilities required to prevent democratic decline.

### The Authoritarian Dynamic

Examines the psychological predispositions that make some individuals more responsive to authoritarian rhetoric under conditions of perceived threat.
